

## CAMP SAWTOOTH FACILITIES

**Mary Popma Chapel:** Nestled in the woods at the north end of camp is our chapel. The Popma family of Boise donated the chapel in 1956 in memory of their daughter, Mary. Double doors open to reveal the chapel's wood and stone structure. A double row of wooden pews, divided by a single aisle, lead to a simple alter and add to the rustic and peaceful atmosphere. Two large windows bring the serenity of the surrounding mountains, forest and sky inside. The chapel seats approximately 100, is equipped with lights, heat and an electric organ. Song books are also provided.

**Camper's Cabins** are arranged in a horseshoe around Greeling Hall at the south end of the camp. Each of the 7 cabins is equipped with bunk beds, to sleep 12 people. The cabins measure 20 X 24 feet, are insulated with finished walls and concrete floors. The cabins are not heated. There is overhead lighting and electrical outlets. The cabins from east to west are: Pine Tree, Maple, Ketchum, Juniper, Hemlock, Galena and Forest.

**Popma Cabins:** Two cabins, donated by the Popma family, are each divided into 2 rooms and contain 2 bunk beds accommodating 8 people per cabin. There is a private exterior entrance for each room as well as an interior door connecting the rooms to one another. They are insulated with finished walls and include overhead lighting, electrical outlets, a small desk and lamp. The Popma Cabins are located at the south end of camp near the Camper's Cabins. The 2 cabins are Alturas/Boulder and Eagle Mountain/Copper Basin.

**Greeling Hall:** Greeling Hall is a modern facility having been completely remodeled in the fall of 2008 and houses the restroom and shower facilities on the north end of the building for the Popma and Camper's Cabins and a recreation room on the south side of the building. The plumbing, heating and electrical have been completely redone throughout the structure. Greeling Hall sits in the center of the Camper's Cabins at the south end of camp. The Girl's facility is located in the northwest side of the building and is furnished with four showers, three flush toilets and a lavatory counter containing three wash basins. The Boy's facility is located on the northeast side and is furnished with four showers, two flush toilets, one urinal and a lavatory counter containing three wash basins. Both the girls' and boys' facilities are handicap accessible, heated, have ceramic tiled floors, fiberglass reinforced panels on the walls, bake coated steel partitions between the toilets and showers and the lavatory countertops are granite. The recreation room, also handicap accessible, is heated, well lit, has carpeted floors and measures approximately 24' by 24'.

The restroom/shower facilities of Greeling Hall are not available after the camp is winterized in early October as the water supplying the camp facilities is shut off and drained for the winter months.

**Hawley Lodge:** This building houses the lodge, the kitchen and the kitchen staff living quarters. The lodge is approximately 30 X 65 feet and used as the dining hall, meeting room and a gathering place for large group activities. The focal point is a large river rock fireplace, which is the main heat source along with two wood burning stoves. (Split wood is located on the north east side of the building.) The south end of the lodge is a concrete floor with the north end being carpeted. The interior is open to the stud walls and ceiling rafters and is not insulated. The lodge is lit with a combination of fluorescent lighting, bulbs and spot lights. There is also access to electrical outlets. Tables with attached benches accommodate approximately 64 people. Approximately 80 folding chairs are also available. The exterior is wood siding with awning

windows on the east and west sides. Stationary windows under the eaves on the north and south ends bring in additional light. To enter the east side of the lodge, walk up approximately 6 steps, to a covered porch and enter through double wide doors. Two single entrance doors to the lodge are located on the northwest and southwest ends of the building. The northwest side also has a patio area with bench seating and a single restroom. This same area is also adjacent to the kitchen and is often used for grilling.

**Kitchen Facilities** are located in Hawley lodge on the west side and can be accessed from the main lodge room, or one of two kitchen doors located on the north and south side. The kitchen is divided into 3 areas, a food prep area, a cooking area and a cleanup area. There is a large commercial gas stove with 4 burners, 2 ovens and a griddle. The overhead vent is equipped with an emergency fire suppression system. There is also a convection oven, a microwave, a commercial mixer, food processor, commercial size pots & pans, cooking utensils, baking pans and serving containers. Dinnerware provided consists of plastic plates, cups, bowls, glasses and silverware for 100 people. There are 3 sink areas. A double sink for food preparation only, a single hand washing sink and a large double sink for clean up. Adjacent to the clean up sink is a commercial dish sterilizer and an area for air drying dishes. The kitchen has a large pantry, walk-in refrigerator and freezer. There is a large pass thru window and two doors from the kitchen to the main lodge. A portable gas grill is available for cook-outs, conveniently located just out the north door of the kitchen in a shaded patio area. A telephone is located in the kitchen.

**The Cook's Quarters are located above the kitchen in Hawley Lodge. This is the private living quarters for the Kitchen Staff and not available for rental.**

**Sam Stimple Bell Tower** is just to the east of Hawley Lodge near the front entrance. It is used to store outdoor recreational equipment. The bell is used to notify campers when to gather for meals, meetings, games, etc. It is also used to notify campers and the Forest Service of fire emergencies. **Three rings, pause, 3 rings, gathers campers; continuous ringing is the emergency signal.**

**Turner's Rest** is a two story frame building located just a few yards south of Hawley Lodge. The first floor is handicap accessible and consists of one bedroom which sleeps 3 – (one bunk bed and one single bed), 2 handicap accessible showers, 2 restrooms (1 handicap accessible) and 2 sinks (both handicap accessible). The lower level also houses a storage area, a workroom and a washer & dryer. Ascend the exterior stairs to the second floor deck and entrance. The interior is carpeted and consists of a comfortably furnished living room, 3 bedrooms, a bathroom and kitchenette. Each bedroom contains 2 bunk beds (sleeping 4 per room). The kitchenette has a sink, microwave and refrigerator. The bathroom consists of 2 toilets, 2 sinks and 1 shower. A small deck is located just out the back door and offers a secluded place to read and relax. The lower floor sleeps 3 and the upper floor 12. **This building is our staff's living quarters during resident camps and is not available from mid-June thru mid-August.**

**The Parking Area** is entered immediately as you drive onto campus. It accommodates approximately 20 vehicles. The parking area is small but a skilled bus driver can maneuver a school bus in and out of camp. Additional parking is located in the camper/trailer lot and will accommodate 8 to 10 vehicles. For safety reasons, all vehicles must be backed into parking spaces. Please do not park in the designated camp Director's parking space when they are in residence, Memorial Day through end of October.

**RV/Trailer Parking** has electrical and water hook-ups for 5 campers and space for a total of 6, depending on size. There is no dumping station. This area can be used as overflow parking for approximately 8 to 10 vehicles. Directly across from Camp Sawtooth is a Forest Service campground which is usually available, Forest Service Camp fees will apply. There is a dumping station located on the west side of the gravel road as you head back to the highway from camp.

**Recreational Areas**--The basketball/volleyball court is an outdoor concrete slab located to the east of Hawley Lodge. There is a large meadow to the north, however, be advised this area is un-level and rocky. The Sawtooth National Recreational Area office has information on area hiking and biking trails. Horseback riding at the Galena Stage Stop Corrals is a 20 minute drive north on Hwy 75. Whitewater rafting is available in Stanley, about an hour drive north of camp. Redfish Lake, also an hour drive north, offers swimming, boating and hiking. Recreational shoppers will enjoy Ketchum's multitude of shops, restaurants, movie theaters and galleries and the short 8 mile drive into town.

**Campfire Ring:** There are two campfire rings. The first ring can be seen, a few yards to the north, from the Hawley Lodge patio. Log seating is arranged in a half circle around the campfire ring. The proximity of this fire ring to the kitchen makes it the perfect place for cookouts, marshmallow and weenie roasts. The second fire ring sits in a more secluded location at the far north end of camp. Follow the trail winding past the chapel to the stone fire ring. Log seating, for approximately 100 people, is surrounded by the mountains, meadows and forests of the Sawtooth National Recreational Area. Traditionally this fire ring is used for worship, sing-a-longs and presentations. All groups should check with the Forest Service office for fire restrictions before igniting camp fires. Water spigots are located at each camp fire circle and an electrical outlet is available at the northern most fire ring. Cut wood is stacked near the Hawley Lodge campfire ring.

**The Director's Cabin** is the office and private residence of the Directors. It is the first building you will see as you drive into camp. This building is not available to lease.

**Workshop:** Camp maintenance building north of Hawley Lodge is off limits to non-camp personnel.

**Pit Toilets** function as the only restroom in the winter months. One facility is located just to the south of the Manager's cabin the other northeast of Hawley Lodge in the meadow. Each building contains a male and female side with two latrines each. Bring your own toilet paper as the latrines may not be stocked. We also suggest you bring Clorox kitchen wipes.

**The "Bunker"** is adjacent to the kitchen and the Hawley Lodge patio on the west side of the building. It contains one bathroom with a flush toilet, sink and shower. This building also contains the water pump, hot water heater and storage.
